# Differences Between the SAT and ACT

# **New SAT**

### Scores:

 The SAT is scored on a scale of 400-1600.

### Questions:

 SAT questions require more time to understand and answer

# Reading:

The SAT has 5 reading passages

## Science:

• The SAT does not have a science section.

#### Math:

 Both ACT and SAT tests have the SAME advanced math concepts: Arithmetic, Algebra I and II, Geometry, and Trigonometry

## Essay:

- Optional
- The SAT is more comprehension focused and asks you to evaluate an argument that someone else has already written for you

# Tools:

 You do NOT get a calculator on all of the math questions on the SAT.

# Time:

 The SAT takes about 4 hours to take and is far less "time intensive" and gives more time per problem.

## ACT

## Scores:

• The ACT is scored on a scale of 1-36.

#### Questions:

 ACT questions tend to be more straightforward.

# Reading:

• The ACT has 4 reading passages

# Science:

 The ACT has a science section that tests your critical thinking skills.

#### Math:

 Both ACT and SAT tests have the SAME advanced math concepts: Arithmetic, Algebra I and II, Geometry, and Trigonometry

# **Essay:**

- Optional
- The ACT wants to see how well you can evaluate and analyze complex issues and asks you to come up with your own argument and support it.

## Tools:

 You get a calculator for ALL math questions on the ACT.

#### Time:

The ACT take about 4 hours to complete.
